General Description:

The course will review terms such as ethics, integrity, compliance, and professionalism. Individuals that have careers in the health care environment face ethical dilemmas each day. This course will demonstrate how professionals can resolve these ethical dilemmas. Practical issues such as meeting the demands of third party payers while providing appropriate care for the patients will be discussed.

2. Distinguish ethics from compliance.
3. Distinguish ethical issues from legal issues.
4. Define the term fiduciary responsibility.
5. Use a practical system to solve ethical dilemmas.
6. Design a code of ethics for a health care organization.
7. Identify resources for later reference as they encounter ethical dilemmas.
