Clea Cornett Evans, Ph.D. completed her doctorate in Clinical Psychology at University of Georgia in 1999. She then completed a Clinical Neuropsychology Postdoctoral Fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine/The Institute for Rehabilitation and Research/ The University of Texas-Houston Medical School Consortium Houston, Texas in 2001. She is currently the director of neuropsychology at Methodist Rehabilitation Center for the comprehensive integrated inpatient rehabilitation program. Patients in the inpatient program include those recovering from brain injury as well as those recovering from trauma such as spinal cord injury or illness such as stroke. Additionally, Dr. Evans has been actively involved in multiple ongoing research projects during her tenure at MRC.
