### About the speaker:

**TED BENNETT, Ph.D.** is a staff neuropsychologist at the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery VA Medical Center in Jackson, MS. Bennett completed his doctoral studies at the University of Mississippi in 2004. He completed an internship at the Little Rock VA hospital where he specialized in TBI and then completed a neuropsychology fellowship program at the Methodist Rehabilitation Center in August of 2006. He began in his current position upon the completion of the MRC fellowship.
